The 21st Annual Santa Barbara International Film Festival (SBIFF) opened at historic Arlington Theatre in Santa Barbara, where Ask the Dust, written by Robert Towne, premiered.

Towne and actress Salma Hayek, who starred in the film with Colin Farrell, lead the pack down the red carpet into the theatre to savor a great movie by a man involved in dozens of films for more than three decades, such as Chinatown, Tequila Sunrise, The Firm and the Mission Impossible series.


The schedule of SBIFF screenings and special events was expansive,
